This was a close contest with both Boys trying hard for the 6 Round journey. However at the conclusion Bourke was declared a majority points winner.

With Grange Old School Boxing at the helm we witnessed another fabulous night of Boxing at Penrith Panthers Club on 1st. July. This organisation, Grange, has developed into the premier Promotional unit in NSW, headed by Bill Tracey and with Gary Fransecso as Matchmaker/Organiser they are going from strength to strength. With a vacant Commonwealth Cruiser weight Title on top of the bill patrons turned up in big numbers knowing they were in for a big night. They were not disappointed.

#### 12 x 3 Minute Rounds.

Dominic Vea (89.05Kgs) v Oscar Siale (87.05Kgs)

This was an incredibly brutal, tough blood bath of a contest. Both combatants were in superb condition, and proved to be unbelievably tough over the 12

round journey. Siale, a southpaw from New Zealand, proved to be a much bigger task than was expected, he was a late replacement and showed he had plenty to offer in his quest for dominance. Vea who is well known to Sydney fans, once again proved how tough and what a big heart he possesses. In the early rounds Siale used his cleverness from the southpaw stance and during the first round had Vea in trouble. Vea finished the round with, once again a broken nose, there was comment at ringside questioning if he could go the distance of 12 rounds in such condition. Then to make matters worse Vea received a cut on the nose during the second round. This caused more blood to flow and in the third round the Referee took Vea to the Doctor for an inspection, he allowed the battle to continue.

The contest became an absolute war with dominance going back and forth, however in the middle rounds Vea was able to land more telling blows, and pinched a couple of rounds. Siale was not to be denied and continued to attack, however in the later rounds Vea came home the stronger and at the end of, perhaps the best, toughest and most brutal contest of the year Vea was declared a majority points winner. At the end of this WAR Siale had his left eye bruised and closing, while Vea, apart from the broken and cut nose had his right eye, cut bruised and closing. Both these courageous Boxers deserve a well earned rest as this type of contest can be Career shortening.

Brown with nine fights to his credit was in against Clemshaw, a forty six fight veteran, who was seen in the popular TV show, The Contender, last year. To begin with Brown moved well and was dictating terms early, however he had a tendency to switch to Southpaw, this suited the cagey Clemshaw who seemed to get stronger as the contest progressed. Early in the second round Brown found himself on the deck, courtesy of a strong right hand from the veteran. After the flash knockdown, Brown became more active and fired off at his opponent. Brown continued to switch, this was playing into Clemshaw's hands and he slowly worked his way into dominance. Then in round six Brown

found himself on the deck again, courtesy of a strong right hand to the midsection. After the mandatory eight count, Clemshaw went straight into the attack, and landed another strong, savage, right hand to the body. Brown was down again, and before the Referee had finished the count, the towel came in from his corner. This should be considered a great learning experience for Brown, and a Tradesman like performance from Clemshaw, who showed there is plenty left in the tank yet.
